DRB approved a COA application for 13 Tattoo Studio at 18 N. Washington Street. P&Z tabled a variance application for setbacks submitted by Brodie DeHass at 736 Diamond Alley for a proposed structure.

Street Dept. Storage Building

Footers dug and being installed at the end of last week, masonry is next.

Utility Program

We met remotely with our CUSI representative and he was able to answer the questions we had regarding upgrading our system. We are planning on proceeding with the upgrade. It would be a one-time \$13,000 implementation along with a \$1,000/month hosting and software cost. The UB4 system will include customer web portal, ACH, e-payment module, etc.

Sidewalk Project

2024 sidewalk work is underway with work completed on Hebron Street and S. Crawford Street. Additional locations will include N. Clay Street, N. Monroe Street, Walkup Street, S. Clay Street, S. Washington Street, and E. Adams Street. In total, we will replace just under 800 feet of sidewalk, aprons, and 30 feet of curb on S. Mad Anthony. Thomas Concrete is performing the work for us this year. Mayor Hoffee asked if we can add to the list the area of 314 S. Clay.

Service Line Letters

As part of the EPA service line inventory mandate, we recently completed the first round of letters to customers informing them of the status of their individual service lines. In total we had 13 lead, 34 galvanized requiring replacement, and 1128 lead status unknown letters sent out. Thank you to Chad, Mary, Marty, and Nate S. for all the work on this. -2025 Bed Tax Grant Applications

Applications were emailed to Council and the Mayor on 11/4/2024. Applications were reviewed and council had no questions. Conn made a motion to accept/approve the 4 Grant Applications. Vaughn seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion Carried. Bed tax Grant awards will be issued in early January of 2025. Mayor Hoffee Thanked the four applicants, HDM, Holmes County Antique Festival, Holmes County Historical Society and the Millersburg Lions Clubs for thoroughly completing their applications.

-2025 Appropriation draft

Council and the Mayor were given a draft of the 2025 appropriations. Hoffee asked questions about the proposed new F550 truck for the street department. She asked Troyer if the street department gets a new pickup truck each year. Troyer said that no, the street department doesn't request a new pickup truck each year. The water/sewer department got a new one this year, but not the street department.

Hoffee then asked if the new F550 would be replacing an existing truck. Troyer said yes, the approximate age of the old truck is 2004. These trucks are used primarily for snow and leaf pick up and are the 'work horses' of the street department's fleet. Troyer added that the street department did get a new full-sized dump truck this year but not a pick-up. No other questions or concerns discussed.

Hines addressed an inquiry about the use of the Police Auxiliary Building by Councilman Vaughn to conduct CSVA testing. Hines found no issue with Vaughn's use of the village-owned building but out of an abundance of caution, Hines reached out to the Ethics Commission for their opinion. The Ethics Committee replied to Hines that Vaughn may use the building to conduct his CVSA Training as long as the village allows others to use it in similar capacities. Hines affirms that no ethical violations have occurred.

Furthermore, Hines feels that it may be best to establish some usage guidelines for those who wish to use the Police Auxiliary Building.

TOPIC:	RITA for Income Tax Administration
PRESENTED BY:	Mayor Hoffee

DISCUSSION: At the last meeting, Curry opened a discussion about the village's income tax administration. Council and Mayor Hoffee all agree that they would like to keep the administration of our income tax local. Hoffee offered a suggestion for getting yearly landlord letters out each year to get up to date tenant information. Hoffee also asked if there is communication from the utility clerk to the tax administrator as address changes occur. Curry said yes, information is shared from the utility clerk. Hofstetter suggested contacting the Board of Elections to see if a report is available showing address changes in the Village. Curry will check into this. Shoemaker asked Curry if this has been an issue in the past. Curry stated that she is not aware of this being an issue in the past; non-filer letters have been done yearly, however this is her first year as Tax Administrator so there is much to be learned and improved upon. Shoemaker then asked Curry what she would like to see to remedy the missing income tax revenue. Curry feels that more time to devote to tax administration would improve revenue. Curry said that discussions with the Village Administrator and Mayor Hoffee about hiring an assistant have recently occurred. Having an assistant to help with day-to-day work/data entry would free up Curry's time so that she can devote more time and attention to tax administration as well as the Fiscal Officer duties that she is still learning. Shoemaker agrees that an assistant is needed. Kellogg agreed that rather than paying an outside administrator she'd like to see our funds stay local.
